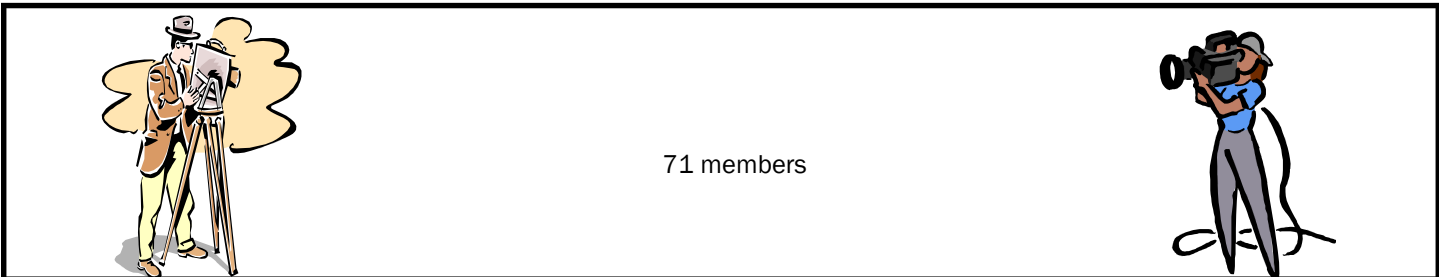

FCC Competition Rules

The Competition Rules and Regulations have been updated for the 2005-2006 season. Copies are available for all members at our Resource Table. This document contains all the regulations for entering competitions.

FCC has 9 monthly competitions for the season and members can enter up to 2 images in each category in which they participate (black/white prints, color prints, slides). In June we'll have the Best of the Best Competition where we can enter a yet-to-be determined number of images that have won ribbons during the year. Further into the season, we'll know the number of images we can enter. This Competition will determine for each category the Photographer of the Year and the runner-up.

Our Selection Team will determine the images to be sent to the Photographic Federation of Long Island (PFLI) where we enter their competition along with 18 other camera clubs. Scores from the FCC competition and the PFLI competition will appear in a future issue of our Newsletter.

FCC Selection Committee

The FCC Selection Committee is responsible for reviewing and selecting the images to be judged at PFLI competitions. The Selection Committee is responsible to the Competition Chair. The 2004 – 2005 Selection Committee was; Joe Crupi, Sarah Williams, Eli Rivera and Ron Caldwell. It is apparent the Committee did an outstanding job based on the scores and standings of FCC members. **Thanks to the Selection Committee.**

Getting Into Digital, Summer 2005, by Ron Caldwell

The Executive Committee decided to use "Getting Into Digital" as a theme for our summer 2005 program. For four sessions we explored what to look for in a digital camera, a computer and methods of getting images into the computer. Our final session had members who are into digital printing to show some of their work and we had demonstrations by our computer gurus: Ann and Stan Strauss and Gary Spielvogel. Special thanks to John Baratta, Mary Thompson, Terrance Howard, Helen Repstad and Bob Green for showing their work.

Again we had a very successful summer program with an average of 45 attendees at each session. Many of those in attendance were visitors who were warmly welcomed.

Thanks to all who attended, setup the room, provided the refreshments and greeted out guests. *The bar has been raised for our program next summer.*

GEORGE LEPP'S "Tips to Maximize Your Photography" in "Outdoor Photographer" September 2005 issue, includes

#3. Venture Beyond What's Expected. *We go to a location with expectations. Open your mind to what's actually there. It might be exactly what you went there for, but not necessarily. It may be better than expected. Let what you find lead to new subjects.*

#4. Know When to Say When. *Knowing when to pursue a subject and when not to, both literally and figuratively, are important. Common sense is sometimes lost in the pursuit. I see photographers approach too closely and stress an animal far more often. The end result—poor pictures, upset rangers, endangered people and animals—is seldom what we had hoped for. We also need to know when a project is complete or unobtainable. Rushing outside in a thunderstorm to get pictures of lightning sounds exciting, but it's foolish. Let common sense be the prevailing key thought.*

#5. Follow your Passion. *There are many similar-looking nature photographs out there. Those that really stand out are the photos that look past the obvious and easy images, where photographers let their passion guide them. Passion will make you research a subject, become intimate with it and return with significant images. The best pro photographers are passionate about what they photograph. It can be a place; it can be an animal or a simple plant. ...*

#11. Embrace Nature, Not Just Nature Photography. *It's easy to get so caught up in the images through the lens that we forget about the subject and the experience happening before us. I'm finally shooting a little less and looking at the things unfolding around me. I still get the shot. I've figured out why I take photographs of nature. It's partly because it takes me to wonderful places where I see spectacular sights. I take the pictures to share those experiences with those who can't or to convince others to go and experience them, too. Embrace what your outdoor photography can do for others. With a little additional work, prints may be shared and film or digital slideshows may be shown to entertain groups or to educate youngsters who might help preserve these places in the future.*
